



ON-SITE FIRE MARSHAL / FIRE WARDEN TRAINING COURSE

Aim of course:

To give fire marshals / fire wardens a more advanced insight into the dangers of fire, and the limitations and use of first aid fire-fighting equipment.

Objectives:

Delegates should, after completing the course, be able to:

- Perform the duties of a fire marshal/warden
- Understand the importance of fire safety at work
- Identify the classes of fire
- Recognise and use first aid fire-fighting equipment safely

Course Duration: 1 day

Number of delegates: Up to 20

SYLLABUS

Understanding fire & fire survival

The mechanism of fire, how fire kills, and how to protect against it.

Human behaviour in fire

Illustrates how people behave in fire, and how fire marshals can overcome them.

Fire routines

The role of the fire warden / fire marshal

Classes of fire & fire extinguishing media

Practical fire fighting

- Use of portable extinguishers on class A, B & C fires
- Simulation of fires involving electricity
- Use of fire blankets
- Chip pan fire demonstration

Requirements:

1. A room with sufficient comfortable seating and a mains power socket for display equipment. It will help if the room can be darkened slightly to enhance projector luminance.
2. An outside area suitable for using fire extinguishers on several small fires without causing annoyance to neighbours.
3. Suitable refreshments.

This course will fulfil the fire extinguisher training requirement for staff under current fire safety legislation for a period of one year.

Certificates of attendance will be issued.

NB! Safety when fire-fighting relies on teamwork, and fires should never be tackled alone. When deciding on the number of fire marshals to be trained, this should be borne in mind, and allowances made for shift patterns, sickness and holidays etc.
